Cork City on the Move...

The "Celtic Tiger" has witnessed increased mobility in the last 30 years and an improved quality of life for its citizens. However, the City of Cork and its satellite towns are also paying the price of poor air quality, increased congestion, global warming, high levels of ambient noise and a reduced average of life expectancy.

European Mobility Week is an opportunity for all of us to rethink our attitude to transport in the City in order to reclaim the urban public spaces and to provide a healthy environment for our children, businesses and communities.

The events organized during this week present an opportunity for everybody to try alternative methods of transport, such as walking, cycling, public transport, carsharing, lift-sharing, etc.

European Mobility Week 2008: 16th to 22nd September

The European Mobility Week started in 2002 and aims to encourage citizens to change their travel behaviour and shift to more sustainable modes of transport. It is supported by the European Commission's DG Environment.

From 16th to 22nd September, over 2,000 local authorities all over Europe and beyond are organising promotional activities and launching permanently measures which will continue to exist after the Week is over.

This Week is the main opportunity locally to encourage and celebrate the various alternatives to solo car driving: walking, cycling, public transport, CarSharing, lift-sharing, eco-driving...

Do you stop to think about how and why you travel?

Do you drive to work or do you cycle?

Do you really look at ways to get better value out of every tank of petrol as soaring fuel prices continue to hit the headlines?

Do you get the bus or Park and Ride when going shopping or do you spend ages hunting around for a parking space?

Do you give the kids a lift to school and social events or do you encourage them to walk or be independent and bus it?

European Mobility Week is the time to think about these questions and the impact that your travel choices have on your finances, your health, your stress levels and the environment we all share.

"Clean Air for All!"

"Clean Air for All!" is this year's theme of European Mobility Week – a topic of particular concern for citizens today.

Over the last few years, many concerns were raised reflecting on the dangerous effects of emissions caused by human activities, especially in the transport sector. Indeed, while transport is essential to help urban areas function, it has also contributed to an array of problems such as loss of productivity and air pollution.

While actions have been taken to reduce harmful emissions from the transport sector and vehicles have become cleaner, the beneficial effects of these technological advances are lost due to the exceptional growth in car use! Although concrete action to reduce the emissions of pollutants has already been taken at all governance levels, more still needs to be done. It is our responsibility to help cope with this problem, by changing our day-to-day behaviour, taking small but efficient actions for our environment.

In Cork events to mark the European Mobility Week 2008 are being organised by Cork City Council Traffic Division, with financial support from the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government and various other local partners.

The Black Ash Park & Ride service will be **free** throughout European Mobility Week (16th to 22nd September 2008). If you are still unfamiliar with this stress-free and reliable transport mode, this is the perfect occasion to experiment with using Park and Ride for your trips to work or shopping!

The Black Ash Park & Ride Buses operate Monday – Saturday between 7:30 am and 7:30 pm. They serve the City Centre (Lapp's Quay) every 15 minutes off-peak and every 10 minutes at peak hours. The site provides about 900 parking spaces and is constantly monitored by security staff during opening hours.

Cork City Council is organising at the Triskel Arts Centre (Tobin Street, Cork) a free public screening of *You Never Bike Alone*, a 82 minute documentary produced, written, directed and edited by journalist Bob Alstead for ICYCLE.CA Productions Ltd. (2006).

You Never Bike Alone explores the story of Critical Mass rides in Vancouver, Canada. This international movement celebrates the joy of cycling and draws attention to how unfriendly cities, in which cars have the upper hand, have become to their inhabitants.

The documentary will be followed by various cycling related short movies directed by Irish and international artists.

Cork City Council, in association with Employee Health and the Health Service Executive, will set up a temporary mobile clinic on the pavement of Grand Parade in order to provide free Health Screenings performed by two nurses.

These are individual 15-minute Health Screening sessions which will also offer personalised advice on exercise/physical activity and healthy transport modes.

The sessions include basic check-up's such as Lung Function Test, Carbon Monoxide Test, Cardio Vascular Test, Body Mass Index (Height/Weight ratio), Blood Pressure Evaluation and Lifestyle Counselling.

"GoCar" is an innovative new carsharing service being introduced in Cork City. It is the first Irish car-sharing club, providing a cost-effective alternative to owning your own car. It allows people access to a car when they need it, from a place near their home or workplace. Car-sharing gives you freedom to travel by car, when you want, where you want, without having to worry about all the negative aspects of car ownership.

Car-sharing is a concept that maximizes the use of vehicles, thereby reducing the number of cars on the roads and helping the environment.

"Avego" is a new technology poised to transform transportation. Designed to reduce wasted seat capacity in cars and dramatically expand commuting options, Avego pairs passengers and drivers through an easy-to-use system using iPhones and other mobile devices.

A cross between carpooling, public transport and eBay, Avego matches a driver's wasted seat capacity, those seats which are unoccupied, with commuters willing to pay for their share of the commute.

Described as "shared transport" the Avego system enables a driver in transit to advertise excess capacity in the car using the new iPhone's GPS feature. This capacity is then matched to riders who need to go in the same direction. Drivers and passengers who want to join the Avego shared transport community can sign up for the beta at http://www.avego.com

Avego intends to capitalize on social networking to encourage more responsible and environmentally friendly behavior and provides both riders and drivers with reduced transport costs.
